







# **Digital Inclusion**




Overall benefit rating for OCN Level 1 in Computer Essentials is 98% on average with 93% participants reporting they had gained confidence

#### ➤ Within the Digital Champion Initiative we have:

- Supported the existing network of 432 Champions and trained a further 234 Champions
- Pilots were tailored to address the needs of various participants
- Held a successful 'Spring Online Week' which involved 3 events held in: Dungiven/Dungannon/Clady


