The Alpha Programme is managed by Groundwork NI, which allocates its funding through the Landfill Tax Credit Scheme to help improve the lives of communities living within a 15 mile radius of the Mullaghglass landfill site at Castlerobin on the outskirts of Lisburn.

A steering group comprising representatives from Lisburn City Council, Belfast City Council, the Northern Ireland Housing Executive, Alpha Resource Management and Groundwork NI adjudicate on applications with funds distributed on a quarterly basis.
